Erasmus Projects

- Funded by the European Commission
- There are thousands of staff and student mobilities taking place annually since 1987.
- What was earlier confined to mobility within Europe, the programme added global dimension in the subsequent years by encouraging collaborative projects with non-EU partner universities.

- University of Kelaniya first benefitted from an Erasmus Mundus project that gave mobility opportunities to many students and staff while receiving incoming staff and student mobility
- Through this project the visibility of University of Kelaniya in the international higher education sector increased rapidly and many new partnerships were established.
- Over 120 staff and student mobility grants have been secured by the university while receiving over 60 guest professors and administrative staff as well as a number of students from the EU on incoming mobility.
- Currently around 2000 students and 100 staff have benefited from Virtual Mobility

CHALLENGES

Main obstacles to the development/improvement of the international dimension:

- Negotiating and approving MOUs
- Status of international offices one of the significant entities of a university
- Appointing permanent staff to the Centre for International Affairs
- Budget issues
- Visa issues for student mobility to Europe when no diplomatic mission is available in the country
- Trade Union action
- Terror attacks e.g.; Easter bomb attack in 2019
- Prevailing situation due to Covid 19 pandemic
