#### HOW TO APPLY FOR A RUSSIAN GOVERNMENT SCHOLARSHIP?

- Find information on the website <u>Studyinrussia.ru</u>
- Announcement is also published on the websites of the Russian Embassy of Myanmar.
- Register on the website, fill out an electronic form and submit your application.
- Wait for an invitation to participate in the selection process (interviews, tests, examinations).
- The operator can publish the schedule of interviews, tests, and examinations on its website or e-mail you directly.
- The tests and examinations are organized by a working group that will issue a list of results containing information about all participants and their scores.
- This information will be published on the official website of the united operator in your country or can be mailed directly to the applicants (please confirm this in the relevant representative office of the *Russian Embassy of Myanmar*).

#### Nature of the Program (Brief information about the program)

#### WHAT'S OFFERED?

- The government scholarship includes: Covering tuition fees and providing a monthly stipend.
- The government scholarship does not include, *travel costs; living expenses*, accommodation, communication services, and medical insurance.
- Accommodation: university accommodation is generally affordable. (about 900rubles- 30000kyats)

Nature of the Program (Brief information about the program)

- Applicants who do not know Russian to a degree sufficient for study in their chosen subject are enrolled in a preparatory department.
- They spend one year studying Russian, as well as several general education disciplines (*Mathematics, Physics, Biology, Chemistry, etc.*) depending on the chosen field of study.
- Applicants, who pass the final examinations, receive the right to continue their studies in their chosen subject.
- The prospective students who do not pass their exams, lose their right to free tuition.

#### **Academic Experiences**

In July 2017, I was enrolled to study the Master Degree of international relations under a government scholarship by the Peoples' Friendship University of Russia.

#### **Peoples' Friendship University of Russia (RUDN University)**



- My Host University is a Peoples' Friendship University of Russia, Situated in Moscow, Russia.
- RUDN University is a comprehensive university bringing together students from 160 countries.
- A multilevel system of higher education (a Bachelor's degree, a Master's degree, a Ph.D.), <u>Technical, natural, medical, economic, humanitarian</u> all areas are represented in RUDN University.
- ✤ 6 faculties, 10 institutes, one academy, and a higher school provide ample opportunities for quality education.
- Engineers, lawyers, doctors, diplomats, financiers, farmers, physicists, mathematicians, linguists, and journalists get their education at RUDN.
- Most of the courses provided at RUDN University are conducted in Russian. There are a few courses that are taught in English by Russian or foreign Professors.

#### **Studying the Russian language**

- ✤ I have been studying at this University for 3 years.
- I began my studies at the preparatory department of the Institute of Russian Language, at RUDN University in September 2017.
- ✤ After spending one year studying Russian, as well as several general education disciplines, I passed the final examinations, and I had received the right to continue my studies for a Master of International Relations.



#### Master of International Relations



- Under this program, I got to study at the Faculty of Humanities and Social Science, RUDN University for 2 years including vocations during full-time learning.
- The first Semester lasted from September to December and Second Semester lasted from February to June.

#### **Social Life and Activities**


- When I had spare time from studying, I hung out with my friends and explored Moscow, the city we lived in.
