# Project Management Challenges and Solutions

#### **ERASMUS MUNDUS**



- Erasmus Mundus International Mobility Programme for Academic and Knowledge Transfer 2014 – 2019 (IMPAKT)
- 8 European and 12 Asian partners from Vietnam, Myanmar, Mongolia, Indonesia, Sri Lanka, Cambodia, Laos, China, Philippines
- Incoming mobility: Academic Staff, Postdoctoral, Undergraduate
- Outgoing mobility: Academic Staff, Postgraduate, Undergraduate

- Consortium Meetings, Selection Committee Meetings and staff training

## Challenges

#### **Financial management**

- All mobility handled by the coordinator, University of Rouen, France
- Travel arrangements and cost of stay for consortium meetings –
   10,000 Euro
- Option given to partners to manage the arrangements through the Coordinator or by the university
- First option was selected due to high commission for international money transfers, red tape and tedious procedures associated with obtaining approval for travel and accommodation costs

#### **Management of mobility**

- Incoming mobility visa issues with long term mobility undergraduate and doctoral mobility
- Managed through application for entry visa well in advance
- Outgoing mobility visa issues with long term mobility undergraduate and postgraduate mobility (5-10 months) to Portugal and Belgium – no consistant procedure
   Visa application through diplomatic missions in India
   Demanded personal visit
- Managed with greatest difficulty. IMPAKT Project funded the travel cost to New Delhi

### **Management of mobility**

- Change of responsible person who managed the project towards the latter part of the project
- Leftover amount from the original budget had to be used within a few months which did not benefit anyone.
- No new call was possible due to time restrictions
- Only previous grantees were given a chance to reapply
- Current grantees offered an extension of the scholarship
- Only 1 student and 1 staff benefited. 2 staff and 2 students did not use the awarded extension

- Covid 19 related impediments affected all related activities
- Financial Management
  - a) Equipment grant adhering to standard procurement procedures
  - b) First instalment of the partner grant of approx.
  - 15,000 Euro sent to UoK –

faced severe difficulties in utilising this amount for staff costs and other activities related to internationalization

#### Solutions -

- Consulting the Coordinator seeking advice and guidance constantly
- Separate budget approved by the Finance Committee and the University Council

- Consular matters affecting long term mobility visits
- Lack of staff in the Centre for International Affairs
- No permanent fulltime staff
- Only contract basis staff
