MODELS OF PROJECT MANAGEMENT FOR UNIVERSITIES: TO ADDRESS INTERNATIONAL CALLS BY ADOPTING A COMPREHENSIVE APPROACH

10 -17 MARCH 2021

The aim of the first module is to present a comprehensive approach towards funding schemes/call for proposals and project design at institutional level that is based on the matching of two main dimensions: one external and one internal.

The first day will be dedicated to deepen all the external factors that impact on the decisions to select, and apply for a specific call for proposals. An analysis of the main actors that open calls and offer financial opportunities will be conducted at regional level. Participants will be asked to contribute to the definition of a taxonomy on the main activities and the main budget units that are usually included in project proposals. Finally, the module aims at identifying the main components of an external call in order to make it more understandable for the university local community.

The second day will be dedicated to the internal factors and to answer a simple but not trivial question: "Are all project funding opportunities relevant for our institutions?" Participants will be asked to evaluate the relevance of a proposal for their own organisation according to a check list. In addition, an analysis of the main principles of collaboration will be conducted in order to identify common criteria to contribute to project proposals, especially when these come from other partners. Finally, once trainees have become familiar with the essential features of a call for proposals and the relevant internal factors that should guide the decision-making process, they will be asked to draft a project proposal starting from the definition of the partnership and the concept note.

Main topics:

- ✓ Asian universities and possible impact of external sources of funding;
- ✓ State of the art on the main opportunities offered and on the main actors active at regional level;
- ✓ Main elements of a call for proposals;
- ✓ Matching institutional priorities with the opportunities and requirements of a call;
- ✓ Models and principles of collaboration in drafting project proposal;
- ✓ Organisational models to participate to calls: phases, roles, activities, competences;
- ✓ Networking with the other institutions;
- ✓ Implications in the decision to apply for a call.
